THE HISTORY OF PHILLIP ISLAND RACE TRACK

Original Circuit:

The orginal 10.6 kilometres of rough and dusty public roads formed a narrow high crowned racing circuit. On paper it looked like a featureless rectangle with four incidental right hand corners. From behind the wheel it was a hard brutal treadmill of a place. Drivers boasted they steered by following the treetops through the billowing dust and flying stones. Despite these claims lack of visibility often resulted in cars colliding during overtaking manoeuvres. This circuit still operates today as public roads.

1951

A historically significant meeting of six local businessmen decided to re-establish motor racing at Phillip Island.

1952

A steering committee formed and the Phillip Island Auto Racing Club (PIARC) developed with a dream "to build Australia's first international grand prix circuit".

The current site was purchased in that year. PIARC calls for 7000 subscriptions at 10 pounds each to assist in the development of the circuit and building work begins. An Alfa was used to measure the three-mile distance required for international certification as an International Circuit.

1956

Between 1952 and 1956 the building of the circuit had met with major engineering hurdles, and PIARC had to call for more money from its shareholders. The Grand Opening Meeting was held with much acclaim in December 1956.

1957-58

Phillip Island stages numerous trophy races including the Australian Motorsport Magazine Trophy Race 1957; the Formula Libre race of 1958 and the Phillip Island Trophy race of 1958.

1960

The Light Car Club of Australia developed and staged the inaugural Armstrong 500 – a 500mile event which was Australia's first long distance race and a precursor to today's Bathurst enduro. The race was won by Frank Coad and John Roxburgh driving a Vauxhall Cresta. They completed the race in eight hours 15 minutes. It was a David & Goliath achievement, because the unknown Vauxhall pilots beat the highly fancied pairing of Bob Jane and Harry Firth in a Mercedes.





Jack Brabham wins the Moomba Trophy driving a Cooper Climax T51.

1962

Due to extensive track damage resulting from the 1962 Armstrong 500, PIARC is unable to repair the damages and the track is closed. Subsequently Phillip Island loses the long distance event, which is transferred to Bathurst.

1963

Melbourne businessman, muffler manufacturer and racing driver, Len Lukey purchases the Phillip Island circuit with a view to redevelopment.

1966

The circuit reopens for racing in April 1966 in the heyday of sportscar racing.

1966-1970's

Phillip Island hosts numerous rounds of the touring car championship. In the '60's, names like Pete Geoghegan, Bob Jane and Norm Beechey starred; while in the '70s drivers like Peter Brock, Allan Moffat, Dick Johnson, John Harvey and Colin Bond were established and over the decade became household names.

1973

Peter Brock wins at Phillip Island in his Holden Dealer Team LJ GTR XUI Torana to claim the 1973 Manufacturers Championship.

Late 1970's

Due to extensive track damage, racing declined at Phillip Island, with the property farmed by its owners.

1985

Phillip Island Circuit purchased by Placetac Pty Ltd, with the view to re-introducing racing to the famous facility.

1988

Barfield Pty Ltd, led by engineer and promoter, Bob Barnard, was awarded a round of the world motorcycle championship. Barfield granted lease on land and begins restoration of the track and facilities.

1989

Phillip Island stages Australia's first round of the 500cc World Motorcycle Championship on April 6-9. In an emotional victory in front of a crowd of 90 000 plus, the race was won by the Wollongong wizz and world champion, Wayne Gardner.

Phillip Island stages Swan Six Hour Motorcycle Endurance Race. Domestic racing resumes for both cars and motorcycles.

1990

Phillip Island hosts its first round of the Superbike World Championship. Phillip Island continues to host a round each year and over the past decade Aussie names racing in the dynamic formula include Michael Doohan, Peter Goddard, Michael Dowson, Rob Phillis, Kevin Magee, Anthony Gobert, Troy Corser and Troy Bayliss.

1991

Phillip Island loses its round of the 500 cc World Motorcycle Grand Prix to Sydney's Eastern Creek, outbid by the NSW government to attract the event to Sydney.

1993

Phillip Island stages its first round of the Shell Australia Touring Car Championship. It was voted as the best round in Australia for that year and again in 1994. Phillip Island Circuit continued as one of the leading circuits for racing and testing to Australia's top touring car teams.

1996

Australian superbike rider, Troy Corser, wins the Superbike World Championship on board a Ducati at the October race at Phillip Island.

Australian Touring Car Championship changes its name to V8 Supercars and Phillip Island continues to host an annual round.

1997

After a six year absence, Phillip Island wins back the right to stage the 500 cc World Motorcycle Grand Prix. Mick Doohan had already secured his fourth straight GP crown when the race came to Island in October 1997. Unfortunately Doohan crashed out whilst leading and Spain's Alex Criville took out the round.

1998

Mick Doohan wins his fifth World title, winning the Phillip Island round to clinch the 500 cc World Motorcycle GP in front of a crowd of 75,000.

2002

The action continues with March's round of the World Superbike Championship delivering an Australian trifecta. World superbike champion, Taree's Troy Bayliss wins both superbike races; while world supersport champion, Kempsey's Andrew Pitt takes the supersport battle.

2004

The property is purchased by the Linfox corporation with a view to compliment the world famous circuit with world class facilities such as an 18 hole Greg Norman designed championship golf course and a luxurious 5 star hotel.

SANDOWN SPRINT

28th April 2013 SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

Holden Sporting Car Club of Victoria will be conducting a Multi Club Supersprint (herein described as "the event") on 28th April 2013 at Sandown Raceway over 3.1km in an anticlockwise direction consisting of at least 4 sessions consisting of 1 warm up lap, 3 timed laps and one cool down lap. There will be Passenger in Vehicle Session conducted over 4 untimed laps, and is open to members of CAMS affiliated clubs. The meeting shall be held under the International Sporting Code of the F.I.A., the National Competition Rules (NCR) of the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport Limited (CAMS).

This will be a Multi-Club Supersprint, promoted by the Holden Sporting Car Club of Victoria. To be held at Sandown Raceway on Sunday 28th April, open to members of clubs affiliated with CAMS in Victoria.

The officials of the event are:

Clerk of Course: Bruce Lethborg Secretary: Phillip Slater Steward: Debbie Tatt

Scrutineers: Greg Black, Peter Scott

Entries open on the publication of these regulations and close on 28/04/2013 at 8.30am. The field will be limited to 100 entries. Entries will be accepted in order of receipt. The entry fee will be \$180.00 for paid entries received before last mail 26/04/2013 and \$200.00 for entries received thereafter. The promoters reserve the right to refuse any entry, in accordance with the NCR and to cancel the event if insufficient entries are received.

Scrutineering will commence at 7.20 am and finish at 9.30am. A compulsory driver's briefing that must be attended by all drivers will then take place after which competition will commence. Competition shall consist of a number of multi start sprints.

Drivers must present their current Club Membership and CA, M, S level 2S Licence or Superior to the event secretary before their cars will be scrutineered.

Competition laps will be manually timed to 1/100th second.

There will be a maximum of 20 competing cars on the track at any one time, which will be started in 3 groups of 4

Classes will be as follows: as per series Group 5 regulations As per Group 5 regulations

The Chief Scrutineer will be the Judge of Fact (in accordance with NCR 177) with regard to class eligibility and vehicle safety. Classes will be combined if there are insufficient competitors in any class. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that the competing vehicle complies with the nominated class regulations.

Failure to so may result in the vehicle being re-classified by the promoter or disciplinary action taking place.

This event shall be open to all vehicles conforming to Section 6, Schedule A and Schedule B of the current CAMS manual.

For Road Registered cars, the minimum requirements include:

Supplementary Bonnet straps for all vehicles except those with forward hinged bonnets.

A safety belt or harness as prescribed in Schedule I.

A fire extinguisher conforming to CAMS requirements. (AS 1841 [except 1841.2]) firmly fitted and readily accessible (BCF/Halon Type extinguishers will not be accepted).

Whilst competing, all competitors must wear:

Non synthetic clothing covering all limbs;

A Helmet conforming with the current CAMS Manual Section 6 Schedule D;

A Safety belt or harness as prescribed in Schedule I.

All open vehicles must have an approved roll bar and the driver must wear approved goggles.

No passengers are allowed in competing vehicles.

Road going tyres must be in a roadworthy condition. Retread tyres will not be permitted. Racing slicks are permitted provided they are in race condition and a R.O.P.S., i.e. a roll cage, is fitted.

Numbers are to be displayed during the course of the competition but must be removed or covered before being used on public roads.

Any competitor exceeding 10kph in the pits/paddock will be excluded.

No re-runs will be permitted for driver error or mechanical failure.

All removable objects (including tools, jacks, spare wheels and wheel trims) must be removed from the vehicle.

Any competitor who after leaving the track re-joins at a dangerous speed or with the wheels spinning will be excluded.

All competing vehicles are required to have an effective muffler in the exhaust system. Megaphones will not be permitted. Camping within the confines of the circuit is strictly prohibited.

Flags to be used are: Red; Yellow; Chequered; Australian National.

Noise level is limited to 75 dBA, measured 30 metres form the track

The consumption of Alcohol or drugs by drivers, pit crews or officials is forbidden whilst the event is in progress. Any competitor consuming alcohol or deemed to be under its influence, or that of drugs WILL be excluded and face further disciplinary action. Breath testing for alcohol may be carried out at any time after competitors have booked in up until the close of the event.

The Passenger in Vehicle session is NOT a timed session and is to be run at REDUCED speeds. One passenger may be permitted in each car during the untimed passenger in vehicle session. All passengers must read, understand and acknowledge by signing the passenger disclaimer form available at the event. Passengers must be over the age of 14. Passengers under the age of 18 must have their parent or guardian sign the disclaimer. Passenger under the age of 16 may not accompany a driver who is a family member. During the passenger session, any driver that approaches competition speeds, passes another vehicle inappropriately or acts in a way deemed to be unsafe by the officials will be requested to explain their actions and may be fined and/or excluded from the event and/or from future events

Insurance will be provided in accordance with Appendix I of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.
